

GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATIONS (GDPR)

As you may already be aware the regulations that cover the use of any personal data that the Parish holds changed at the end of May. This means that we must hold a Data Privacy Notice which is relevant to our Parish and governs how we process personal data, and what we can do to/with this that can identify a living person, including collecting, using, storing and managing such data. In order to comply with the new regulations we can no longer assume consent and there must be evidence of the consent gained. Everyone whose details are included on our Electoral Roll is asked to complete a consent form which is available on the table, together with a Data Privacy Notice, which gives full information on this process. Mark 4:35-41


That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side." Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat.
